Six students from courses covering Architecture, Architectural Technology, and Rural and Spatial Planning and Surveying were interviewed and the four judges were very impressed with the quality of the presentation. Update on Devanha:

**Presentation by Alan Grant, CEO of Langstane Housing Association
March 12, 2010 @ Langstane Housing Association, Aberdeen**



Alan Grant brought us up to date on what has happened and what the future holds for Devanha Limited, which was set up as a strategic procurement vehicle for social housing in the North East of Scotland.

He told us that, in his opinion, Devanha has had mixed success in achieving its original objectives. It's been successful in delivering a hitherto undreamed of scale of programme, reasonably efficiently. It has also established working relationships with a new team of consultants and contractors. However, it has created a huge amount of work which has made those involved question the amount of effort required. He concluded that having made the effort, however, the partners would want the opportunity to continue their collaborative working in another 5-year programme.

Sarah Malone: 'Judge it when we build it'

Sarah Malone provided us with a unique insight into the challenges of the project to build 'the world's greatest' golf

resort and the positive implications for the North East of Scotland.

She pointed to a range of business opportunities which would be generated by the direct and 'ripple effect' of the development: the creation of about 1200 construction and 100 operational jobs, a boost to tourism and the local economy by commissioning bespoke products from local suppliers, the sourcing of local employees and contractors, the linking with other tourist attractions in Scotland, and the regeneration of surrounding areas.

In his thought-provoking presentation, Bob Reid explained the factors behind the evolution of local planning and brought to the fore the not-so-obvious feature of the Aberdeen city centre: 'compact but not well connected and permeable' and suggested his own solutions to the identified problems.

His talk, imbued with a concern that 'you should be careful of doing anything today which can kill off a good opportunity in the future', sparked a heated discussion and generated lots of questions.
