<p>VIRTUAL - Zero Carbon Development - Offsite construction modular housing</p> <p>Two of Britain’s biggest challenges are Climate and Housing. Offsite-constructed homes are increasingly recognised as the answer to the crisis and the solution to speed up the quantity of development if we are going to reach our targets, to both reduce carbon emissions and build 300,000 new homes a year in England. Manufacturing precision engineered homes in a factory, rather than building them in rain, wind and snow in a field, enables us to create better quality, energy efficient housing and also empowers us to deliver more homes, more quickly.</p> <p>According to the UK Green Building Council the built environment contributes 40% of the UK’s total carbon footprint. When it comes to housing it’s so difficult to fathom that something which provides us with protection and shelter is so damaging for the environment.
