As the 16th National Student Awards programme drew to a close, the 17th was already underway. The Student Awards is a superb example of logistical planning, thanks to a committed team of member volunteers from across our branches, guided by National Awards Ambassador, Vanessa Lancaster.

The Awards coordinators invite UKwide Universities to nominate their best female students, and support them as they move through the Awards process. The regional judging days are held in the early spring, followed by branch Awards events and culminating in the national judging morning in September. The national finalists take part in a Mentoring training session and, finally, the fabulous 'Best of the Best' Awards dinner.

Former National Student Awards winner, Katie McManus of HBD, gave a short speech explaining the impact her win had had on her early career and enthusing the 2022 finalists to maximise every opportunity.

The keynote address was given by Jane Findlay, Immediate Past President of the Landscape Institute who spoke directly to the finalists saying, "You're all about to embark on fantastic and fulfilling careers in a sector that needs your skills and creativity like never before. This is, I think, a watershed moment for the built environment. Against the challenges of climate change, biodiversity loss, and public health, all eyes and all hopes are on the next generation of architects, contractors, designers, developers, engineers, managers, planners, and more to deliver infrastructure that transforms our lives for the better."

## Better bookings

Women in Property 0 nts and Revie



Good news for Women in Property's event bookings system. Members and nonmembers can now book and pay for events directly from the website event listing, rather than following a link embedded in the event flyer. This functionality makes booking onto events simpler for non-members and allows members the choice to book via the either the WiP App or the website. Links directly to the appropriate website page can also be circulated via social media.
