We had a great presentation on the history, evolution and challenges of the building by ADP Architecture who also gave us a guided tour of this iconic building. Edinburgh Council invested £4.75m in refurbishment to restore and adapt the B-listed former Granton Gas Works Railway Station which had laid in disrepair and open to the environment for more than 20 years.

We also heard from the project engineer on the innovative drainage strategies with cutting edge SUDS scheme in close collaboration with the landscape design.

James Hutton Institute Site Study

McLaughlin & Harvey hosted members and guests of Women in Property Northern Scotland on an exclusive behind-the-scenes tour of the James Hutton Institute's groundbreaking new Advanced Plant Growth Centre and International Barley Hub.

Attendees got a first-hand look at two flagship innovation projects that are set to revolutionise the field of food research and security. Supported by a capital investment of £45m from the UK Government and an additional £17m from the Scottish Government via the Tay Cities Region Deal, these projects represent state of the art innovation in the sector.

Understanding the collaboration, laboratory and incubation space that will enable the next generation of food research and security was hugely interesting – and hopefully we can return in a year's time once the buildings are operational to witness first-hand how these spaces will drive innovation, collaboration, and tangible advancements in food research and security.
